DITCH MOWING

Saddle Hills County's Ag Services Department is currently mowing ditches on County rights-of-way, beginning in the Woking area and moving west in the coming weeks. If you encounter the tractor and mower while it is cutting, please proceed with caution and yield to oncoming traffic. Please note, that Alberta Transportation are responsible for mowing on all provincial highways.

2024 ROADSIDE SPRAYING IN PROGRESS

Crews from the Agricultural Services Department are currently spraying roadsides throughout the County, weather permitting, to protect agricultural producers from noxious and prohibited weeds. The spray areas for 2024 include the Gordondale, Northmark, Westmark, and Woking areas.

WATCH OUT FOR CONSTRUCTION VEHICLES

Please note that the County has begun re-gravelling on County roads, as well as construction work to repair the side on the Pouce River Bridge, on Twp. Rd. 801. Please watch out for workers and large equipment, slow down, and drive with caution through these areas.

NORTHMARK ROAD (TWP. RD. 764) PAVING PROJECT

Work has begun on the Northmark Road (Township Road 764) Asphalt Paving Project. The project will see 5.6 km of the road paved, east from Range Road 70 to Highway 731. The project is due for completion by October 15, 2024.

ASPHALT CHIPSEALING - RANGE ROADS 93 & 102

Please note, that the County will be completing asphalt chipsealing to extend the life of the asphalt paving, beginning **August 6, 2024**, on Range Road 93, from Highway 681 to Township Road 830, and on Range Road 102, for one mile south from Highway 49. The project is due for completion by August 16, 2024. Please slow down, drive with caution, and watch out for workers, construction vehicles, fresh oil, and loose rocks in the area.

2024 TAX PAYMENTS

A notice to landowners that the deadline for the 2024 property taxes, July 31, has now passed. As of **August 1, 2024**, a 6% penalty has been applied to the current year's outstanding tax balance. Payments can be made online through most financial institutions, or you can visit us in the office. We accept credit cards, debit cards, and cheques.
